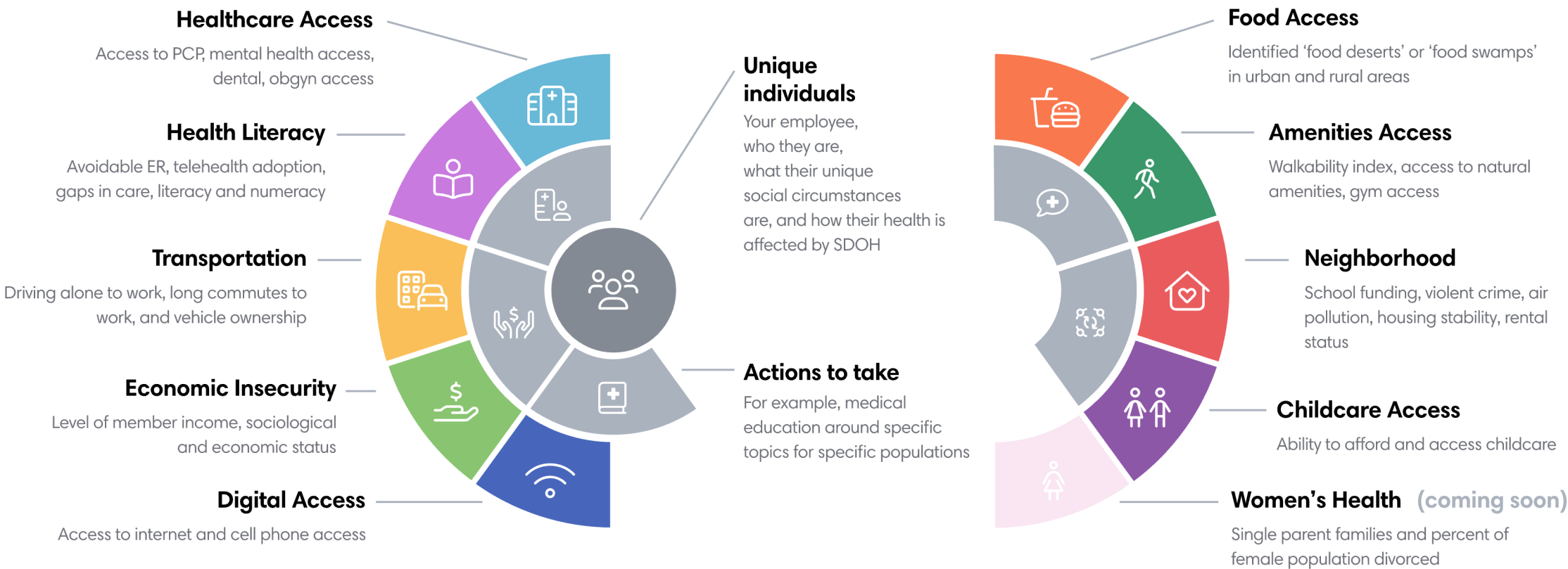
What are Social Determinants of Health?



SDoH are environmental conditions where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, quality-of-life outcomes, and risks. – Healthy People 2030, US HHS

How are SDOH Measured?

The Artemis SDoH Index is designed to closely capture how social factors impact your employee health outcomes. Our index is composed of your members demographics, claims data, and public data that is weighted and ranked to expose social disparities with a score.

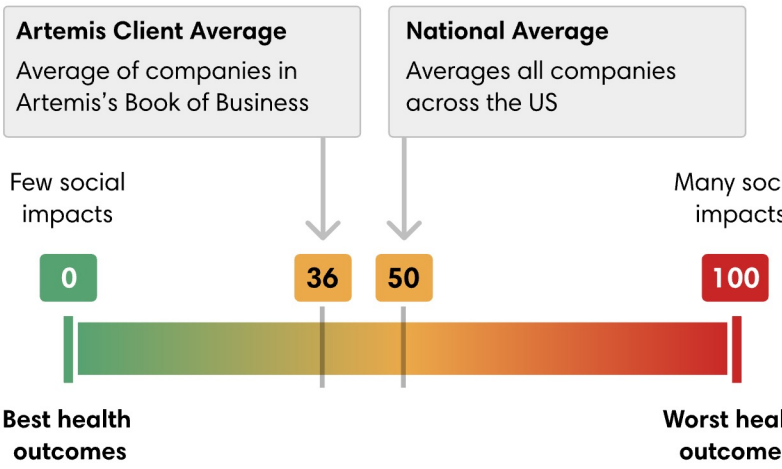
The Index scores 31 factors across our domains of health

SDoH Insights analyzes your member population using 31 social factors across our domains of health equity to assess member health. These insights will uncover demographic & geographic disparity populations with a focus on cost, utilization, management of care.

What the scores mean

Higher scores reflect more social factors, correlating to worse health outcomes.



Overall SDOH health

The SDoH index is designed to closely predict how social factors impact your employee health outcomes, for example, the correlation of economic insecurity with life expectancy and preventable hospital stays.

The higher the SDOH index score, the more social factors are affecting member health outcomes.

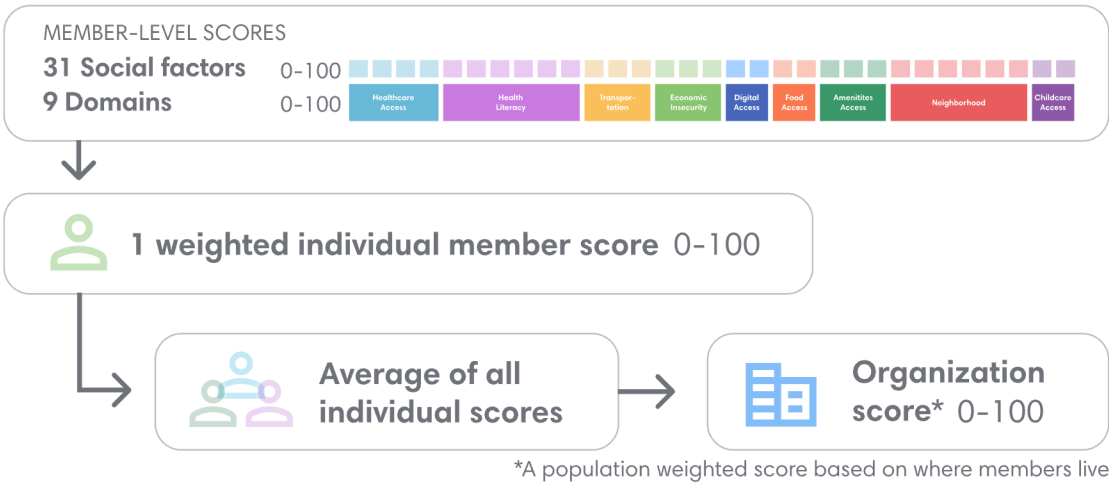
All indexes are ranked against National Data, Artemis BoB members and companies.

Percentile value categories:

- 0 - 18 : Low
- 18 - 45 : Medium
- 45 - 100 : High

How are the scores created?

Each individual member is scored for every social factor and domain score. Organizational scores are then weighted using every member score and where they live.



What do the scores mean?

All social factor variables, domain variables, and overall SDoH Index range from 0 to 100. All have a similar “meaning” with 0 representing the lowest and 100 being the highest social determinants affecting health outcomes.

We tested the performance of the SDoH Index by correlating it to existing socioeconomic indexes, health outcomes, and Artemis BoB metrics to confirm it’s correlation with member health outcomes

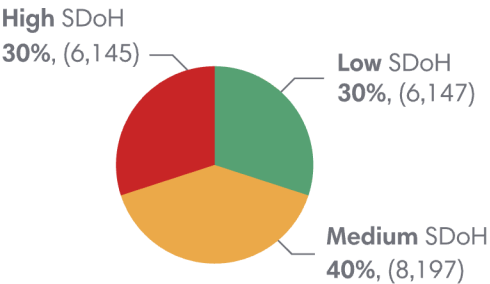

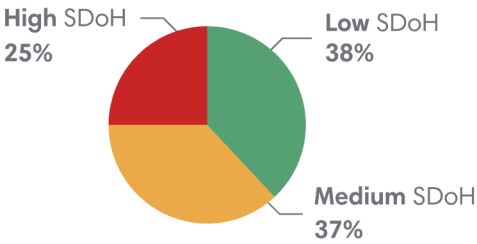

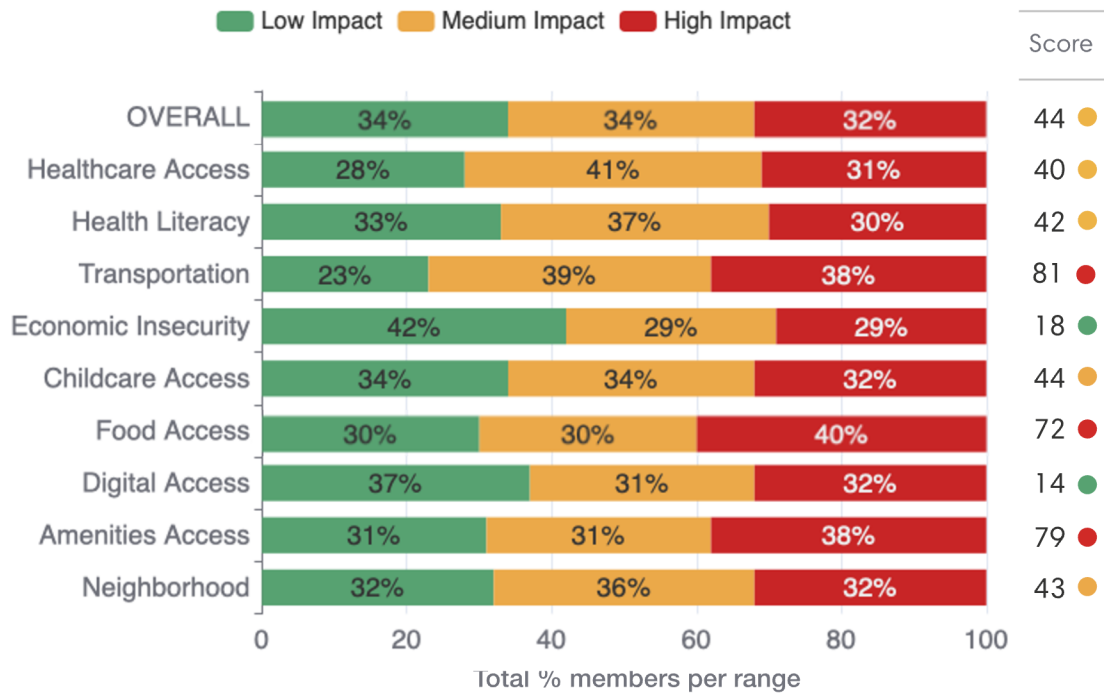

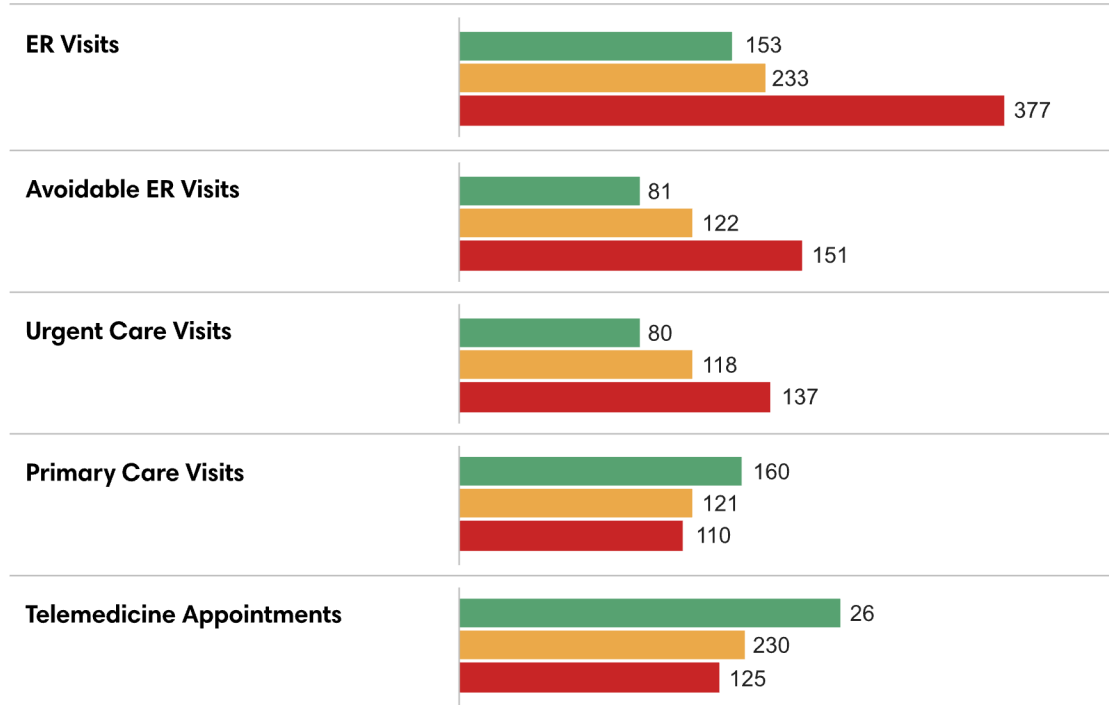

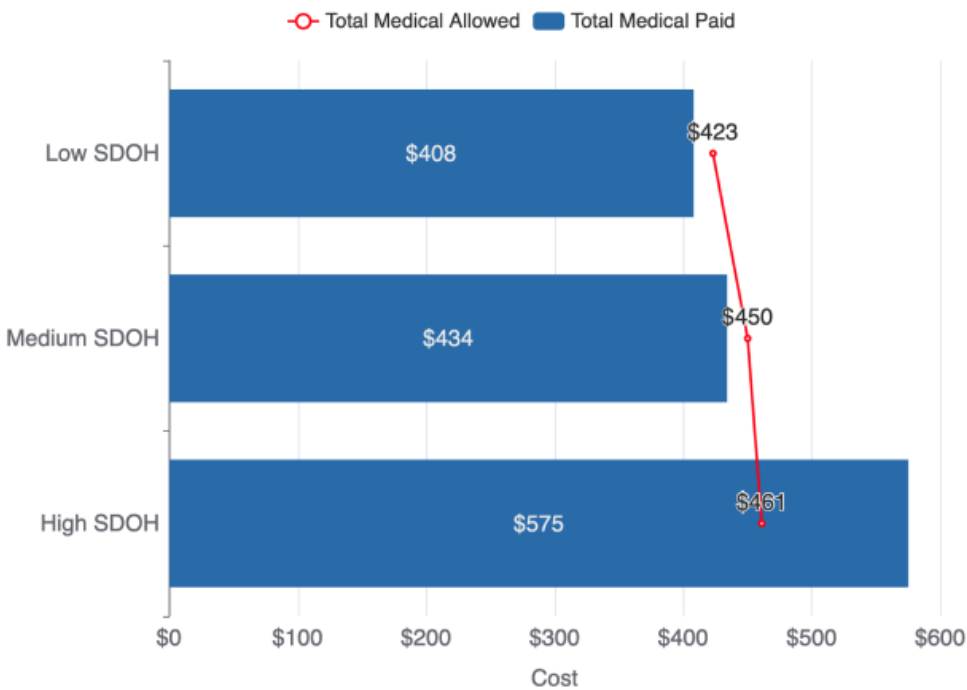

What do the scores mean?

Medical spend per product range indicates the average monthly medical expenses, detailing both the allowed amount (total medical allowed PMPM) and the actual paid amount (total medical paid PMPM).

Pharmacy spend per product range represents the average monthly prescription costs, showcasing the allowed prescription amount (RX allowed PMPM) and the actual paid prescription amount (RX paid PMPM).

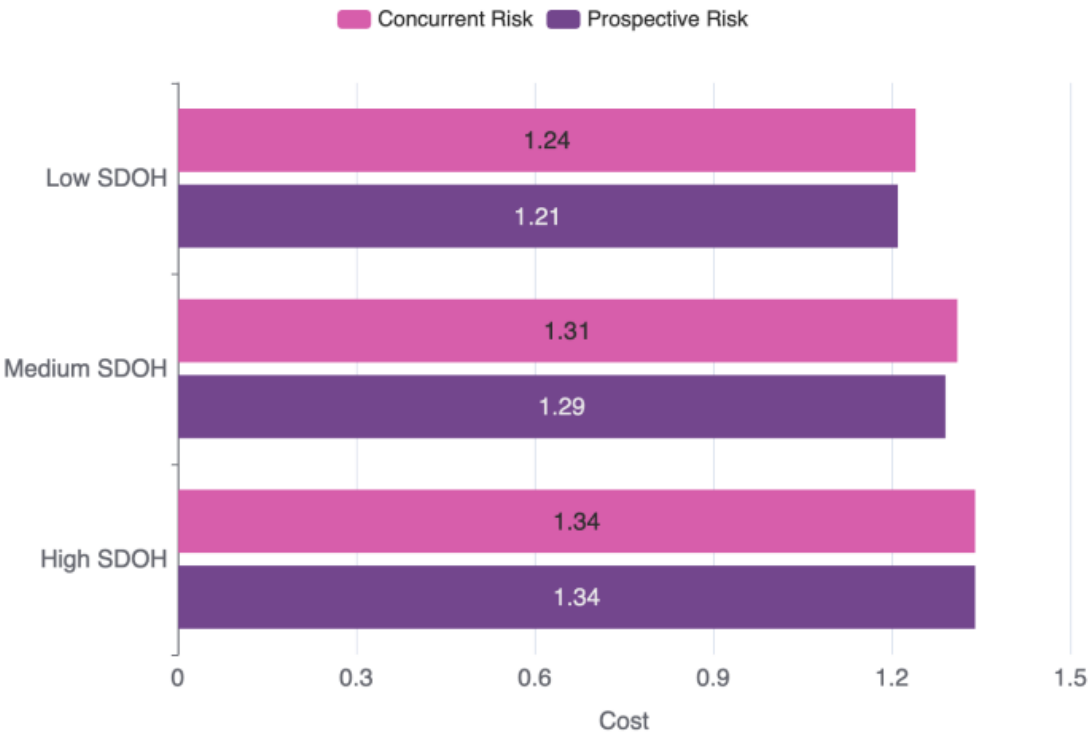

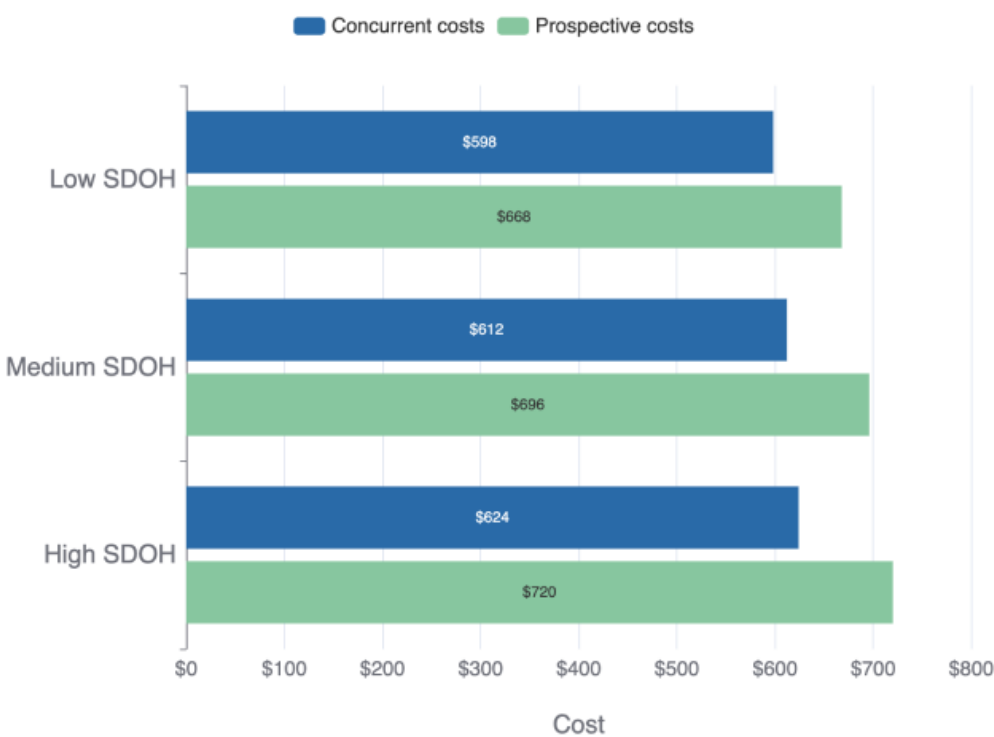

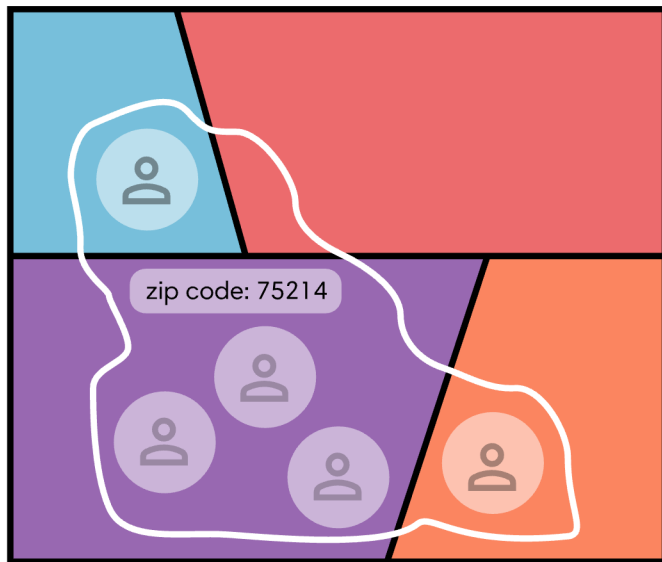

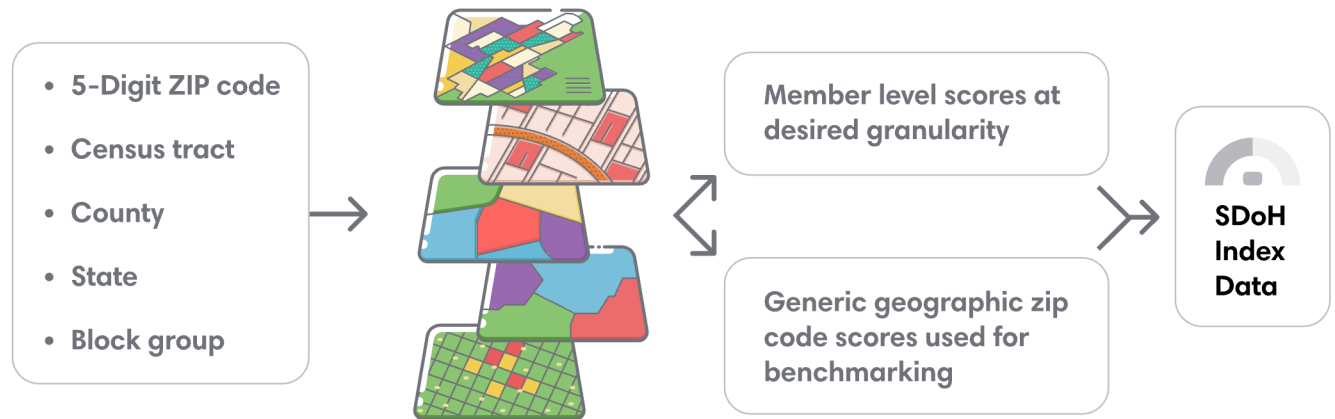
Weighting measures across geographic area

To show accurate scores at a granularity is meaningful, we tie member statistics to each geographic level we analyze in order to weight scores appropriately

Visualize member health outcomes based on location as they relate to SDoH. The Index scores are a weighted average of each member, across all 9 domains and 31 social factors.

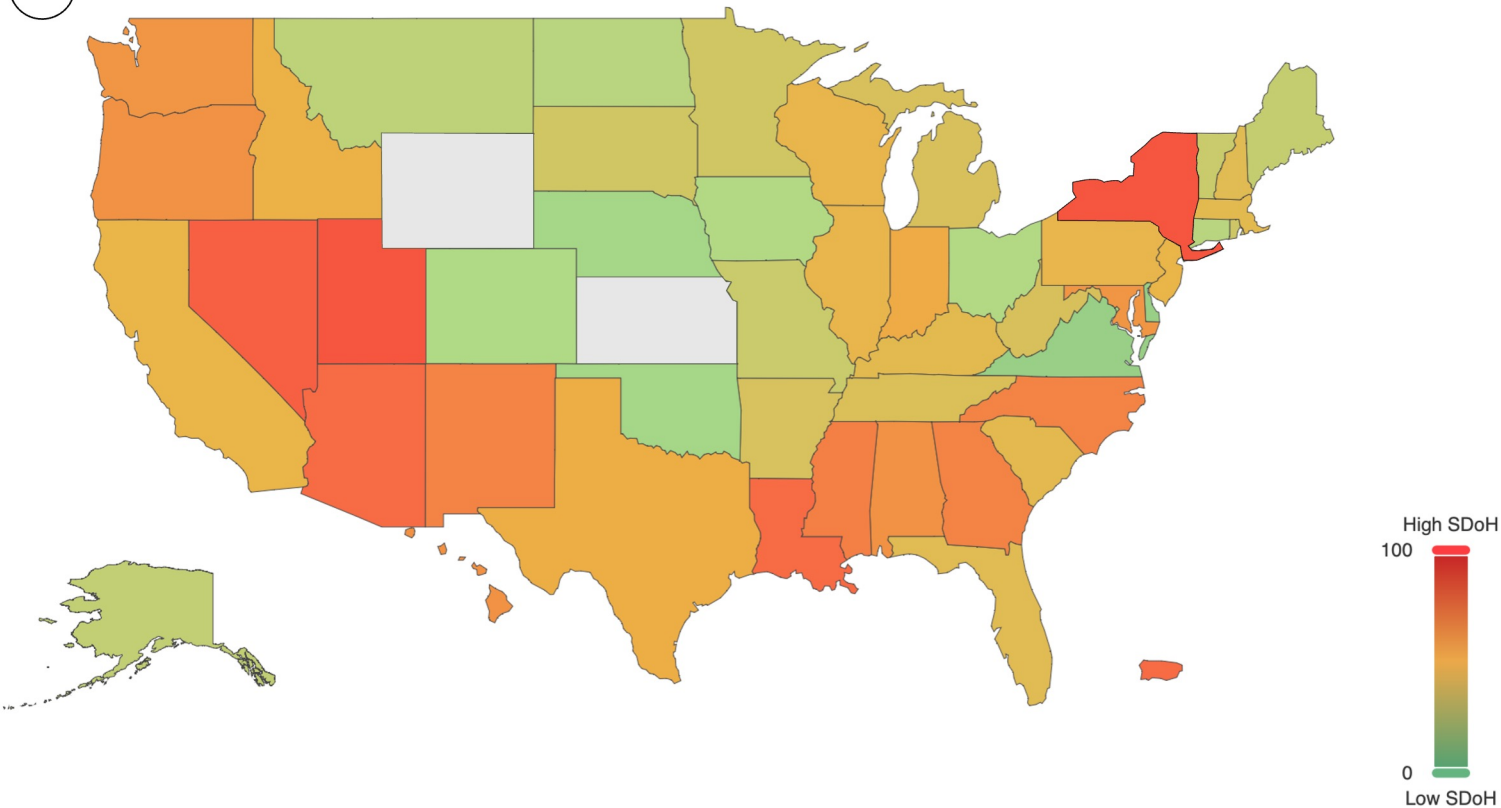

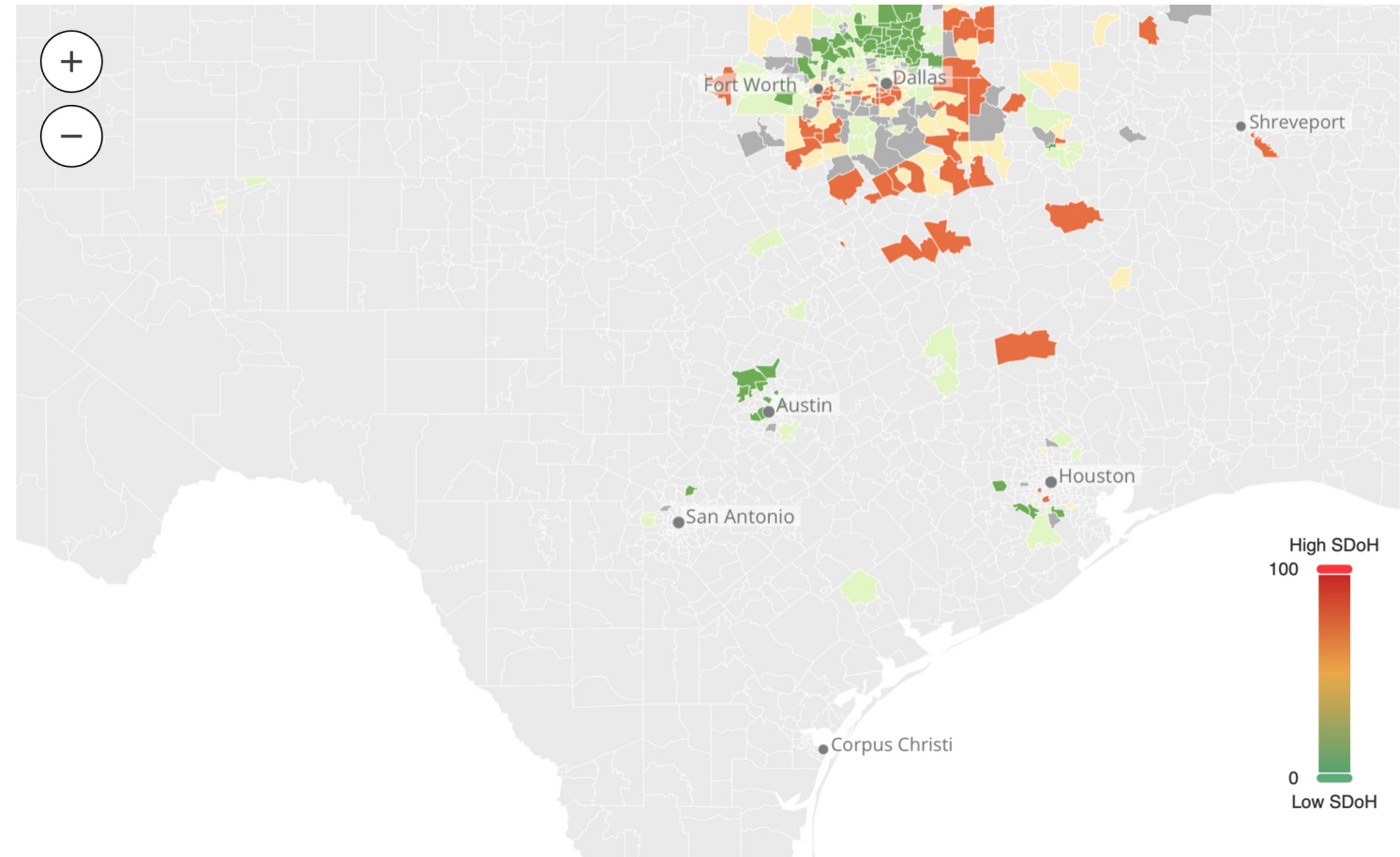

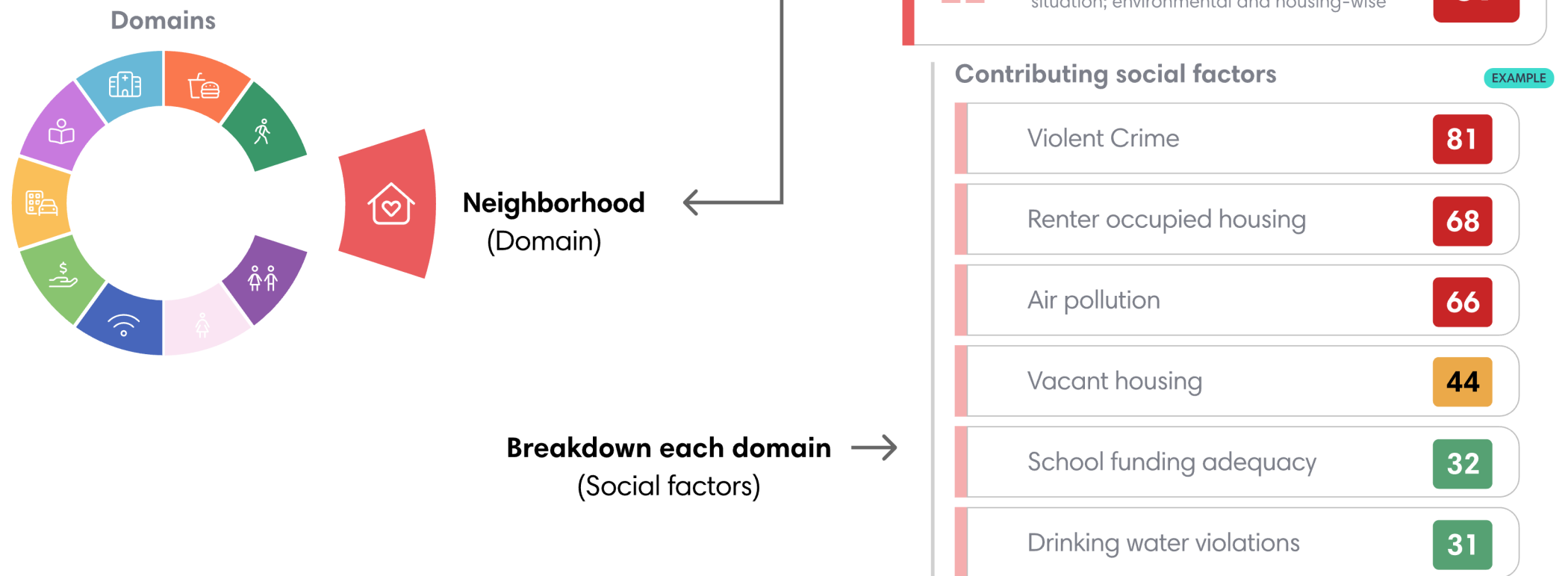

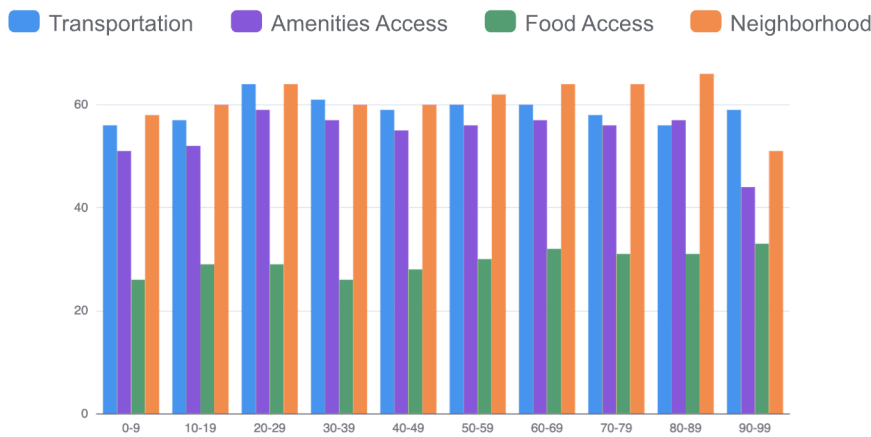

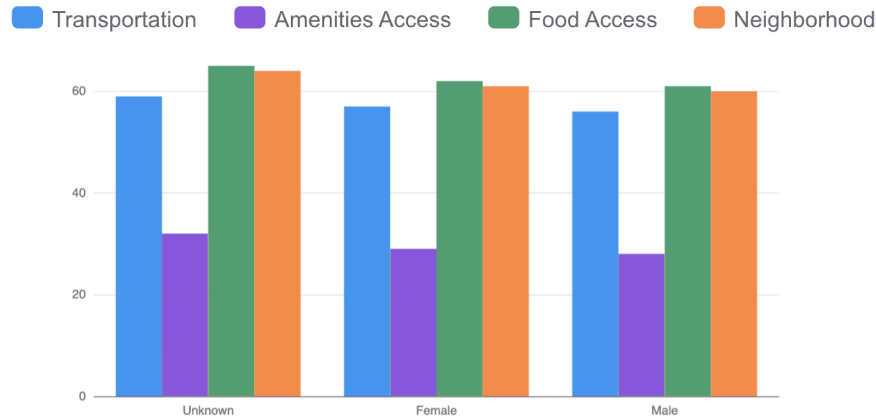

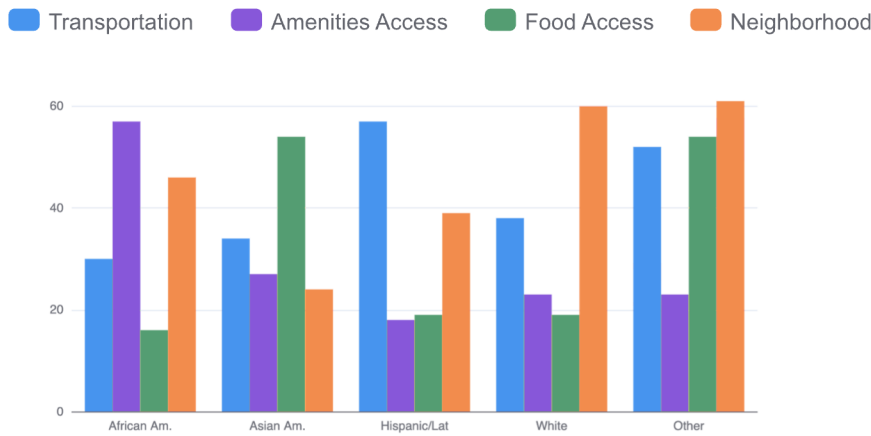
By Age Band



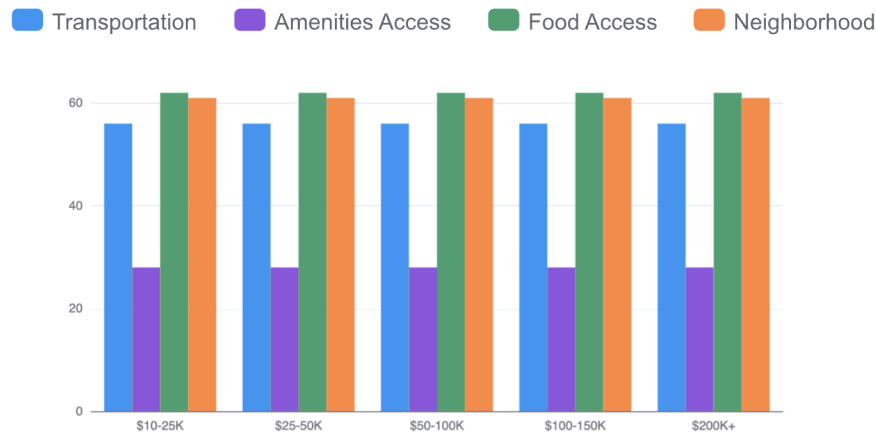
By Gender

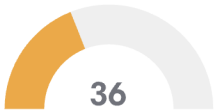

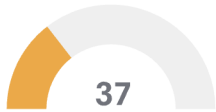

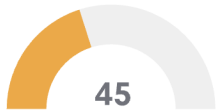

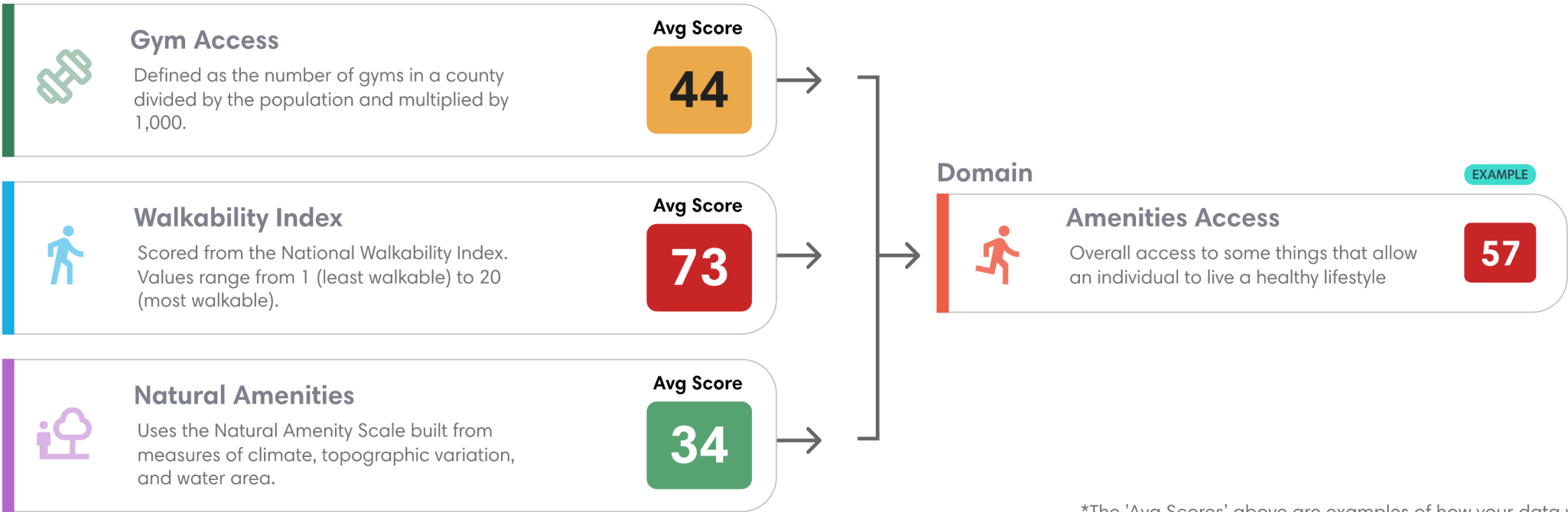

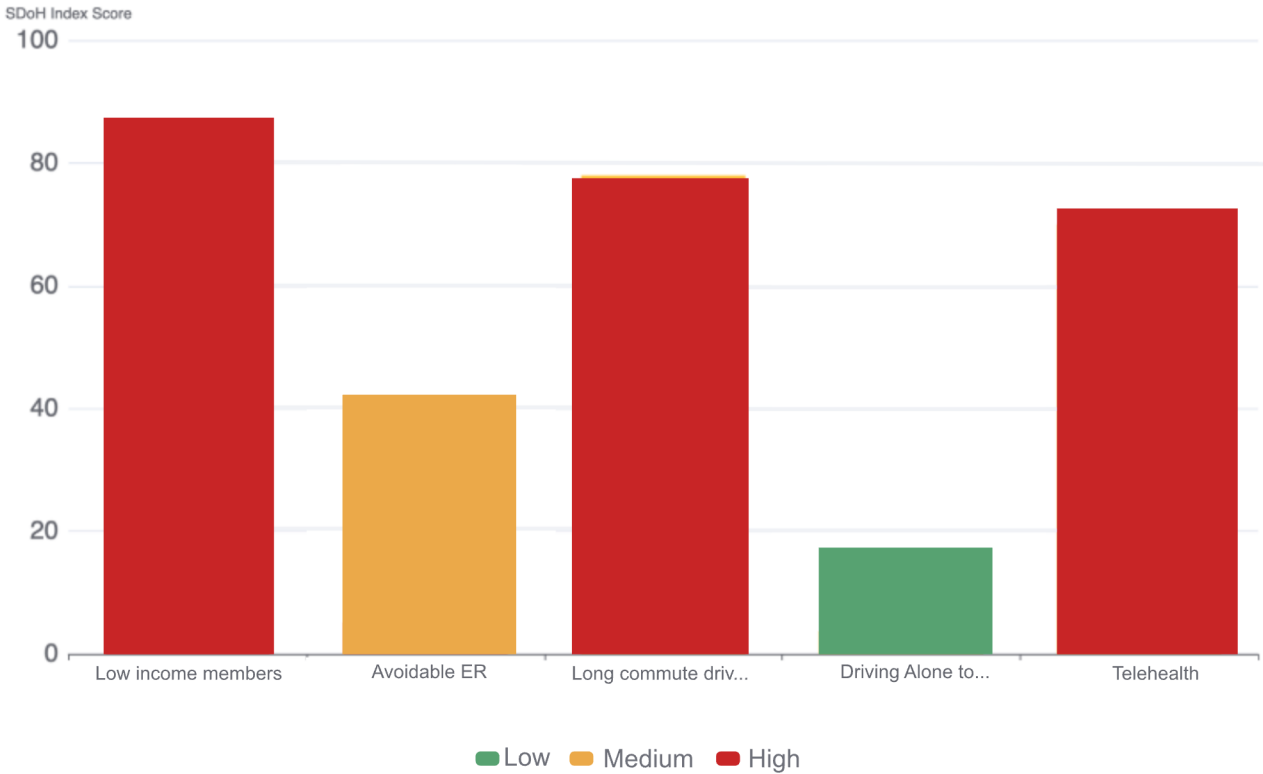

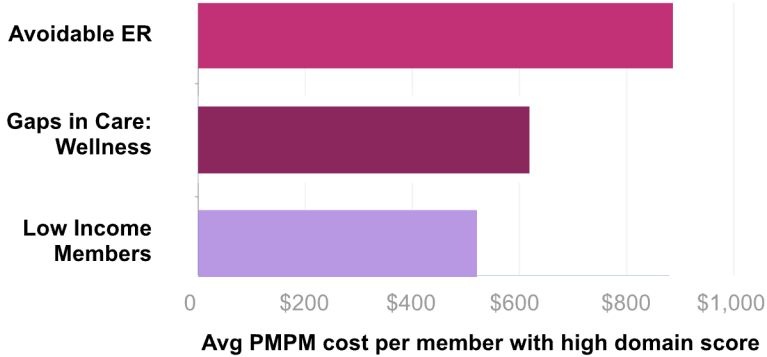

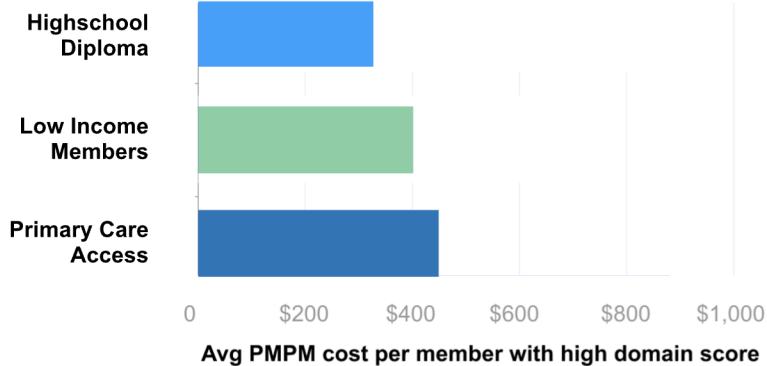

Factors associated with highest PMPM Costs



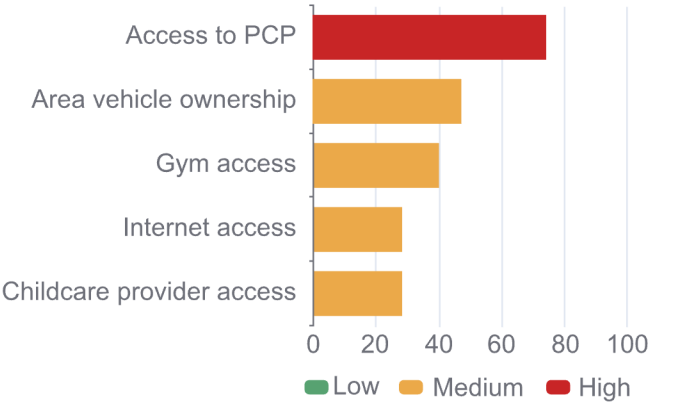
Factors associated with lowest PMPM Costs

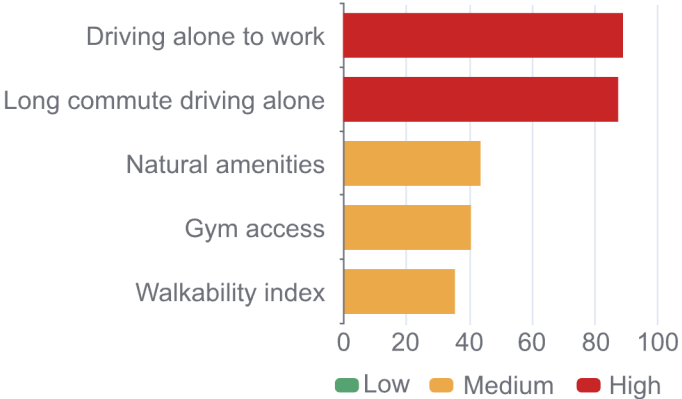

Primary Care

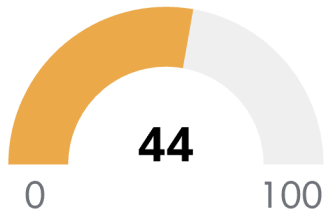
HEALTHCARE ACCESS

A primary care provider is usually an internist, family physician, pediatrician, or non-physician provider (e.g., family nurse practitioner, physician assistant). Research shows that access to primary care is associated with positive health outcomes.

The total number of non-federal primary care physicians per 1,000 population.

Mental Health

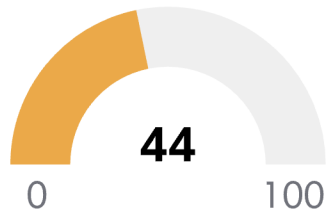
HEALTHCARE ACCESS

Improving mental health access can reduce the risk of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. It's important to social norms so that the health of all members of society is a priority.

Dental Access

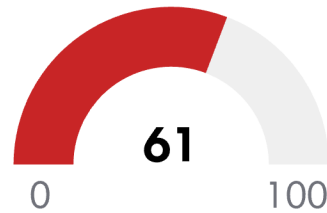
HEALTHCARE ACCESS

A primary oral care provider is typically a general dentist, family dentist, pediatric dentist, or non-dentist provider (e.g., dental hygienist, dental therapist). Studies indicate that access to primary oral care is linked with improved dental health outcomes.

The total number of dentists per 1,000 population.

OB/GYN Access

HEALTHCARE ACCESS

Improved access to obstetric and gynecological services ensures that women receive proper prenatal care, reducing the risk of complications during pregnancy and childbirth. This promotes maternal and infant health, leading to healthier families and communities.

The total number of non-federal primary care physicians per 1,000 population.
